Key accomplishments

1. **Sentiment Analysis, SA, identification of personal opinions and the prediction of their orientation as positive, negative and neutral:** We demonstrate significant improvement of state-of-the-art methods for SA in speed (=3 times more unit processing per second), accuracy (around 20%), and explainability (= rule based) by combining a BERT-based Syntactic Parser with linguistic rules and statistical methods for identification and measurement of Lexical Ambiguity.

2. **Application of NLP tools in the domain of endangered languages and linguistic minorities in Peru and Ecuador.** Automatic techniques hold promise for improving analysis of endangered languages by replacing costly and time-consuming human analysis of survey data. We demonstrate, however, that current (deep-learning based transformer models) fail in inferencing implicit information from these data sets in part due to their small size, highlighting directions where improvements are needed.

3. **Identification of differences between Humans and Machines in the domain of Natural Language Understanding and Inferencing (NLU and NLI):** Capturing inferencing information in human communication is one of the language processing areas where large-language models are most likely to fail. However, finding reliable methods to evaluate the performance models is not trivial in itself. Current methods typically rely on use of annotated data sets which tend to be context dependent and hence unreliable. We incorporate, for the first time, linguistic rules, which are known to be more generalizable, to design a quantitative test of model performance in capturing inferencing information and use this test to evaluate several state-of-the-art models.

4. **Development of new methodological tools in the identification of sociolinguistic and socioeconomic features.** The connection between language use and socioeconomic factors is a powerful tool for studying fundamental linguistic and social phenomena. Traditional survey methods and linguistic corpora, however, fail to capture language use on small spatial scales of neighborhoods and city districts where many social dynamics occur. We harness the rich metadata and precise geolocation information in Big-Data sources such as social media to spatially resolve patterns of language use on scales down to city blocks for the first time, providing an unprecedented view of social dynamics.

5. Documentation of Linguistic Minorities and Endangered Languages: Documenting endangered languages and linguistic minorities is an important part preserving our cultural heritage, as recognized by UNESCO. Sardinian, in particular, has a rich set of grammatical markers such as complementizers not present in any other language. We document the use of these markers and show that the distribution of complementizers is relevant for understanding grammatical phenomena in a variety of present-day languages.

6. Evaluation of Linguistic Theories on large amounts of corpus data. Linguistic Theories like theoretical assumptions in Formal Semantics (Frege, Montague, Partee) and Generative Grammar (Chomsky) are rarely evaluated on large amounts of data from a corpus or a survey. We evaluated theoretical assumptions showing in which domains they fail and how they need to be updated. Phenomena such as language change and linguistic variation show challenging domains for formal semantic theory and generative grammar.
